A Word from Pastor Lori

Thanks to all who were there Sunday to hear my brief presentation on how we will proceed during the interim time. Next, I'll have a short (and very different) survey for you that will help focus the cottage meetings. The cottage meetings will help us take the pulse of CLC and determine what needs attention now. Finally, we'll hold a two-part congregation-wide event to envision together and create mission goals, which will be the basis for your Ministry Site Profile.



HERE ARE TWO WAYS YOU CAN HELP THIS PLAN GO SMOOTHLY:

1) Participate! Turn in your surveys (and we promise that the call committee and I aren't planning any more of these!). Start inviting one another to form small groups for the cottage meetings, and plan what days/ times you'll generally be able to meet with me; we'll have sign ups in a few weeks. And in the cottage meetings and the eventual visioning gatherings, attend and be thoughtful and honest about your views of life at CLC. Every voice needs to be heard to accurately discern who you are as a congregation at this point in your long and faithful history.

2) Pray! Easy, right? Pray for your call committee and steering team, and for me as your interim pastor. Pray for clarity in what God is calling you to next, personally and as a congregation. Pray for the ongoing ministries of CLC. Pray for the guidance and inspiration of the Holy Spirit during this transitional time. And don't forget to thank God for this beloved community of Christ Lutheran Church!

I began thinking about how I might help him and his family regain some dignity and I thought wouldn't it be great to give him a substantial gift card to Home Depot so he could begin building his tool chest again?
