INTRODUCTION

Someone who isn't part of Jesus' own circle is casting out demons in Jesus' name, and the disciples want him stopped. They appeal to Jesus, as Joshua did to Moses about the elders who prophesied without official authorization. Like Moses, Jesus refuses to see this as a threat. Jesus welcomes good being done in his name, even when it is not under his control. The circle we form around Jesus' word must be able to value good being done in ways we wouldn't do it, by people we can't keep tabs on.

FIRST READING- NUMBERS 11:4-6, 10-16, 24-29


Soon the riffraff among them started complaining and whining, and Israelites said, "Who will give us meat to eat? We remember the fish we used to eat freely in Egypt, and the cucumbers, melons, leeks, onions and garlic! But out here we're wasting away; there is nothing here but manna for us to look at!"

Moses heard the people, family after family, wailing at the entrances of their tents, so much so that God's anger flared up again. Moses was aggrieved, and said to God, "Why do you treat me this way? Are you so displeased with me that you must burden me with this whole nation? Was it I who conceived these people, was it I who gave birth to them, that you should say to me, 'Carry them at your bosom, like a nurse with a baby at the breast, to the land that I swore to give to their ancestors?' Where am I to find meat to give to these people, when they come to me weeping and saying, 'Give us meat to eat'? I cannot carry this nation alone! The weight is too much for me. If this is how you will deal with me, just allow me this one favor and kill me now! Spare me from seeing such misery as this!"

God said to Moses, "Gather together seventy of your elders, those you know to be leaders and officials among the people. Have them come to the Tent of Meeting and take their place there with you. So Moses went and told the people what God had said. He gathered seventy elders and had them surround the Tent. God came down in a cloud and spoke to Moses. Taking some of the Spirit that was in Moses, God bestowed it on the seventy elders whom Moses had gathered there; and as the Spirit came to rest on them, they were seized with prophesying, and did not stop.

Now two other elders, one named Eldad and the other Medad, were not in the gathering but had stayed behind in the camp. They had been summoned to the tent, but had not gone; yet the Spirit came to rest on them also, and they prophesied in the camp. When a youth came running to tell Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp," Joshua, ben-Nun, who from youth had been Moses' aide, cried, "Moses, stop them!" But Moses answered, "Are you jealous for my sake? If only all of God's people were prophets! If only God would bestow the Spirit on them all!"


SECOND READING- JAMES 5:13-20

Are any of you in trouble? Then pray. Are any of you in good spirits? Then sing a hymn of praise. Are any of you sick? Then call for the elders of the church, and have them pray over those who are sick and anoint them with oil in the name of Christ. And this prayer offered in faith will make them well, and Christ will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven. So confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed.

John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone using your name to expel demons, and we tried to stop it since this person was not part of our group."


Jesus said in reply, "Don't try to stop it. No one who performs a miracle using my name can speak ill of me soon thereafter! Anyone who is not against us is with us. The truth is, anyone who gives you a cup of water in my name because you belong to the Messiah will certainly not go without a reward.

"Rather than make one of these little ones who believe in me stumble, it would be better to be thrown into the sea with a large millstone hung around your neck. "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It would be better to enter Life crippled than to have hands and go into Gehenna, where the fire never goes out. If your foot causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better to enter Life crippled than to have two feet and be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. It would be better to enter the kindom of God with one eye than to have two eyes and be drawn into Gehenna, where 'the worm never dies and the fire never goes out.'

"Everyone will be salted with fire. "Salt is good. But if salt loses its flavor, how can you make it salty again? "Have salt in yourselves, and live in peace with one another."



THE LORD'S PRAYER


Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us.




